It's clear that Spetisbury Primary is a place where children flourish, and I am confident this year will continue in the same positive direction.



## Statutory Assessment Success: A Cause for Celebration!



We are delighted to share the fantastic results from our **2023-2024 Statutory Assessments**, which showcase the hard work and dedication of our students, staff, and community. Spetisbury Primary continues to excel, and we are proud to be performing well above the national average in several key areas.

These impressive results reflect our school's commitment to providing a well-rounded and engaging education. For example, **96%** of our Year 6 students achieved the expected standard in **Reading**, **Writing**, **and Maths**, compared to the national average of **61%**, placing us in the top **1% of schools nationally**! This builds on the excellent results from the previous year where our progress from **Year 6 in 2022-2023** also placed us in the **top 1% of schools** nationally. Although there are no progress measures for last year's cohort due to the impact of COVID-19, this outstanding achievement underscores the resilience and commitment of our pupils and staff during challenging times.

Our youngest learners are also thriving, with **89%** passing the Year 1 Phonics Screening, and **84%** of our Reception pupils achieving a **Good Level of Development** (GLD).

These achievements demonstrate the strength of our school community and the opportunities we provide for every child to succeed. We are incredibly proud of all our students and look forward to continuing this success in the year ahead!

## Uniform Reminder



This is a gentle reminder to please ensure all uniform items are clearly **named**. We are confident that this reminder is given regularly, but we continue to build up a tub of school uniforms, including brandnew school sweatshirts. School policy allows parents to claim any unnamed jumper they come across while searching for their child's lost items. Help us reduce lost property by labelling all belongings! Stickon name labels can rub off over time, and our top tip is to regularly back these up by marking your child's name in Sharpie on the label and also on the washing label in case any marking fades.

#### Attendance and School Absence



If your child is going to be absent, please inform the school **before 9:30 am** to avoid an unauthorised absence. You can notify us via text, email, or by leaving a telephone message. Please note that phone messages are not always reliable, so we encourage the use of text or email whenever possible.

We also want to remind parents of the importance of good attendance. The government's target is **95% overall attendance** for the year, and consistent attendance is vital to your child's learning. We appreciate your efforts in helping us reach this goal.

## Free school meals and Pupil Premium

If your child qualifies for free school meals, they will have a **healthy meal every school day**, and can get:

- access to free holiday clubs
- extra money for their school towards more teachers and activities

You could save over **£450** a year!

If your child is in reception to year 2 and you receive qualifying benefits, **you could get extra £££'s for your school!**

Many parents of children in Reception, Year One, and Year Two mistakenly believe their child qualifies for the Pupil Premium because they receive Universal Infant Free School Meals. However, these meals are provided to all children in these year groups, regardless of household income, and are not means-tested. As a result, we may be missing out on valuable additional funding for eligible younger children. This funding is crucial, as it helps support catch-up programs, provides assistance with uniform purchases, and covers the costs of school trips and other enriching experiences.
