

Spetisbury CofE Primary School – Outcomes 2024–2025

The 2025 outcomes demonstrate continued strength across the school, with attainment securely above national averages and a growing proportion of pupils achieving at greater depth. These results reflect both academic rigour and the supportive environment that allows children to thrive.

Highlights

- 74% of pupils achieved the expected standard in reading, writing and mathematics combined (national: 62%), placing the school in the 80th percentile.
- 15% achieved the higher standard, almost double the national figure of 8%.
- Reading remained a clear strength, with 89% reaching the expected standard compared with 75% nationally.
- 91% of pupils passed the phonics screening check, continuing a pattern of strong early literacy.
- 82% of children achieved a Good Level of Development in Early Years, significantly above the national figure of 68%.
